<b>Approved to Carry:</b>	<b>Spare Batteries – up to 58 (includes lithium ion not exceeding 100Wh, non-spillable up to 12V and 100Wh and dry cell batteries)</b> <b>Spare Lithium Ion Batteries – up to 2 exceeding 100Wh but not exceeding 160Wh</b> <b>Lithium Ion Battery – exceeding 100Wh but not exceeding 160Wh contained in a device</b>

This document permits carriage of the above passenger's batteries and lithium battery powered device on Air New Zealand, provided the following carriage requirements have been met:

### Spare Batteries - Carriage Requirements

- all battery terminals must be protected e.g. retail packaging, taped, speciality container etc.
- no more than 60 batteries (in total) per person
- carried in **carry-on baggage only**

### Lithium Ion Battery in a Device - Carriage Requirements

- battery does not exceed 160Wh
- carried in carry-on baggage or if in checked bags, must be:
  - turned off e.g. not in sleep mode and can't be accidentally turned on
  - protected from damage
